CHINA QIGONG STUDY TOUR 2008 With Qigong Master Simon Blow 22nd September to 10th October 2008

This year's 19 day tour takes us to the major destinations of Beijing, Xian and Shanghai and also along the legendary Silk Road. Experience the historical towns on the ancient trade route between East and West, over thirteen different ethnic groups live in this region. This area is shrouded in mystery and many legendary stories have come from the people travelling this route.

We arrive in Beijing and gaze in wonderment at the Imperial Palace in all its glory, visit the Great Wall and peer into history as you follow with your eyes the Great Wall disappearing into the distant peaks, like the backbone of an ancient dragon. We visit the Xiyuan Hospital talking to both doctors and patients, learning about Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). Beijing is a rapidly expanding city, maintaining elements of its ancient past and emerging future. Beijing will be the host for the 2008 August Olympic Games.

We board an overnight train to Xian were we will view the Terracotta army as it still guards the first Emperor. Then on to Gansu province staying in the capital Lanzhou; from here we travel by bus viewing the breath taking scenery to Xiahe and the Labuleng Monastery,(2920m above sea level) which is the leading Tibetan Monastery town outside of Lhasa, here we stay three nights visiting the ancient Temples and Monasteries, experiencing this ancient culture. We visit the ancient city of Turpan an important staging post on the Silk Road and which was a centre for Buddhism before converting to Islam in the 8th century. We arrive in Urumuqi the capital of Xinjiang province in the outer reachers of China boarding Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Afghanistan and Pakistan. Urumbqi is the furthest city in the world from the ocean.

Our journey takes us to Shanghai the New York of the east before flying home.

Sept 22 Sept 23	Depart Sydney Monday 22nd September 9.35am arrive Beijing 10.15pm local time. Visit the Xiyuan Hospital, after lunch to the Imperial Palace (called the Forbidden City, for only those in the court would be permitted to enter). The Palace brings to you the great splendour of the Celestial Kingdom.		
Sept 24	Bus to the Great Wall, with plenty of time to walk along one of the wonders of the world and then to the Ming Tombs.		
Sept 25	The Summer Palace and the Temple of Heaven, evening train to Xian. We travel in first class sleepers, four to a cabin, comfortable and relaxing.		
Sept 26	Arrive Xian at 7.30am. This is the ancient capital of China during the Tang Dynasty from 700 AD. You will see the terracotta warriors and other ancient relics.		
Sept 27 Sept 28	Tour the city and view the pagodas and temples. Evening train to Langzhou After breakfast a 4 hour bus trip, viewing the amazing scenery as we climb to 2920m above sea level to Xiahe and the Labuleng Palace built in 1709 and at its peak housed 4000 monks, it has about 1500 today .This area is called the Gan Nan Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture.		
Sept 29/30	Visit ancient temples and monasteries, practise Qigong and meditation. We will have meetings with Buddhist monks, experiencing this amazing culture.		
Oct 1	Bus back to Langzhou after breakfast, then evening overnight train to Dunhuang		
Oct 2	Arrive at 7am, Dunhuang is a lush green oasis in a flat barren desert landscape, visit Singing Sand Hill and the Crescent Moon Lake		
Oct 3	Visit the Mogao Caves set in the desert cliffs seeing the 1000 year old Buddhist mural paintings. Overnight train to Turpan		
Oct 4	Turpan which is 150m below sea level and is the second lowest depression in the world after the Dead Sea. Visit the ruins of the ancient city and the small streets with grapevine trellises. Visit Grape Valley set amongst the desert landscape.		
Oct 5	View the pagodas, the historical Buddhist cave temples and the 1000 year old underground irrigation canals, two hour bus trip to Urumuqi		
Oct 6	Visit the Heavenly Lake and South mountain ethnic group village		
Oct 7	Mid morning flight to Shanghai arriving at 3pm		
Oct 8	Shanghai Qigong Research Institute, shopping etc and acrobatics show in the evening		
Oct 9	Local tour during the day and evening flight home		
Oct 10	Arriving Sydney 8am
